Dassai is made from 100% Yamada Nishiki rice, the gold standard of sake rice. Observe the brewing process through windows looking into production rooms during the tour and tasting experience. Pair seven different sake, including Dassai Blue type 50 and a sparkling nigori, with small bites from The Culinary Institute of America and fresh sushi.

They grow 80 varieties, which are picked as late as possible, allowing more flavor to develop, then pressed in small batches on a traditional rack and cloth press.

Craft Beverage Historical Timeline

1677

The first grapevines were planted in the Hudson Valley for winemaking.

1720s

Hudson Valley became a prominent apple-growing region.



1807

Vassar Brewery opened using local hops, barley and malt for English-style ales.



1861

Matthew Vassar's success as a brewer enabled him to found Vassar College, one of the first women's colleges in the U.S.



Late 1800s

Saw the proliferation of cider mills in Dutchess County, both as small-farm and large operations; New York Gazette reported nearly 10,000 gallons produced.

1913

Fishkill Farms, where Treasury Cider is now made, was founded by Henry Morgenthau, Jr. Pictured below with his friend and Dutchess County neighbor, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who named him Secretary of the Treasury in 1934.



1933

"I think this would be a good time for a beer."

— President Franklin D. Roosevelt, March 12, 1933, upon signing the Beer-Wine Revenue Act. This legalized and taxed beverages containing no more than 3.2% alcohol.

Prohibition ends in the U.S. in December 1933 with the ratification of the 21st Amendment.

1976

Dutchess County became the home of several wineries after the New York State Farm Winery Act was passed.



1982

Millbrook Vineyards and Winery was established and is the oldest in the county.



2003

The longstanding U.S. ban on black currants was lifted. Dutchess farmer Greg Quinn spearheaded this movement, and his currants are used by C. Cassis and Branchwater Farms.



2023

Dassai Blue Sake Brewery opened in Hyde Park. It is the first of its kind in the U.S. producing the highest premium grade of sake.






